

CHILD CARE

Parents on limited income or in need may be eligible for financial help with child care costs through **St Thomas-Elgin Ontario Works Child Care Fee Subsidies**.

- To qualify for childcare fee subsidy you must be a resident of Elgin County, have legal status in Canada, and both parents or the single parent must be working, self-employed or going to school during the hours when your child would be in childcare.
- You must be in financial need, as determined by the most recent Income Tax Federal Notice of Assessment.
- You may also be considered to be in financial need if you are eligible for social assistance or your child is diagnosed with a special need.
- Call Ontario Works Monday-Friday from 8:30am to 4:30pm 519-631-9350 (choose option 3 on the phone).
- Parents are seen by appointment only. Appointments are usually scheduled 2 weeks in advance.

If you are not in receipt of social assistance (OW or ODSP), or are above the threshold for these sources of income, rent is calculated at 30% of your "gross" monthly income (before deductions are made for such things as taxes, CPP, EI, garnishments, etc.). Elgin St Thomas Housing Corporation (ESTHC) operates the Centralized Waiting List system on behalf of 11 social housing providers in St Thomas and Elgin County. Subsidized housing is available in Aylmer, Dutton, Port Burwell, Rodney, St Thomas and West Lorne.


